Growing in FAITH

Think of all the many places we can grow in our faith — at home with our families, with our parish community, through participation in religious education or faith formation classes, through our youth groups and Catholic schools, through retreats and days of reflection. Many of these options are funded by the Bishop's Annual Appeal. As the Diocese seeks to grow and renew these programs, it is through the graces from the Holy Spirit and the generous gifts to the Bishop's Annual Appeal that we are able to explore new ways of engaging the lay faithful.

We also grow our faith by assisting our seminarians with the \$60,000 annual seminary costs,

prayerfully and financially supporting them in their journey when they are called to be strong and faithful shepherds.

This Spring, God willing, Bishop Bradley will ordain one man to the priesthood and one to the transitional diaconate. Six additional young men are currently in seminarian formation.



Increasing our HOPE

As Bishop Bradley wrote, "Imagine the faith alive once this renewal is underway, where everything is made new again: our churches filled to capacity with those yearning for the Eucharist; our youth engaged in the faith; our seminarian class numbering in the dozens; our renewal leading us to better serve those on the margins and living out the Beatitudes — a diocesan family of faith nourished by our renewal and living our lives inspired by the Gifts of the Eucharist and the Holy Spirit."*

It is in this spirit of hope we conduct our first Diocesan Synod on Priestly Life and Ministry to in turn ultimately better support our parishes, priests and lay faithful to be the centers of hope and examples of Christian joy so needed in today's world.



Serving in CHARITY

Whether it's Bread of Life volunteers offering those in need fresh food and pantry staples or Caring Network volunteers helping young mothers-to-be navigate pregnancy and parenthood, serving others in charity is essential to experiencing a Holy Spirit-centered renewal in



our Diocese. When we "live the mission of the Eucharist", we live for others rather than ourselves, in an intimate communion fueled by Jesus' love and sacrifice for us.
